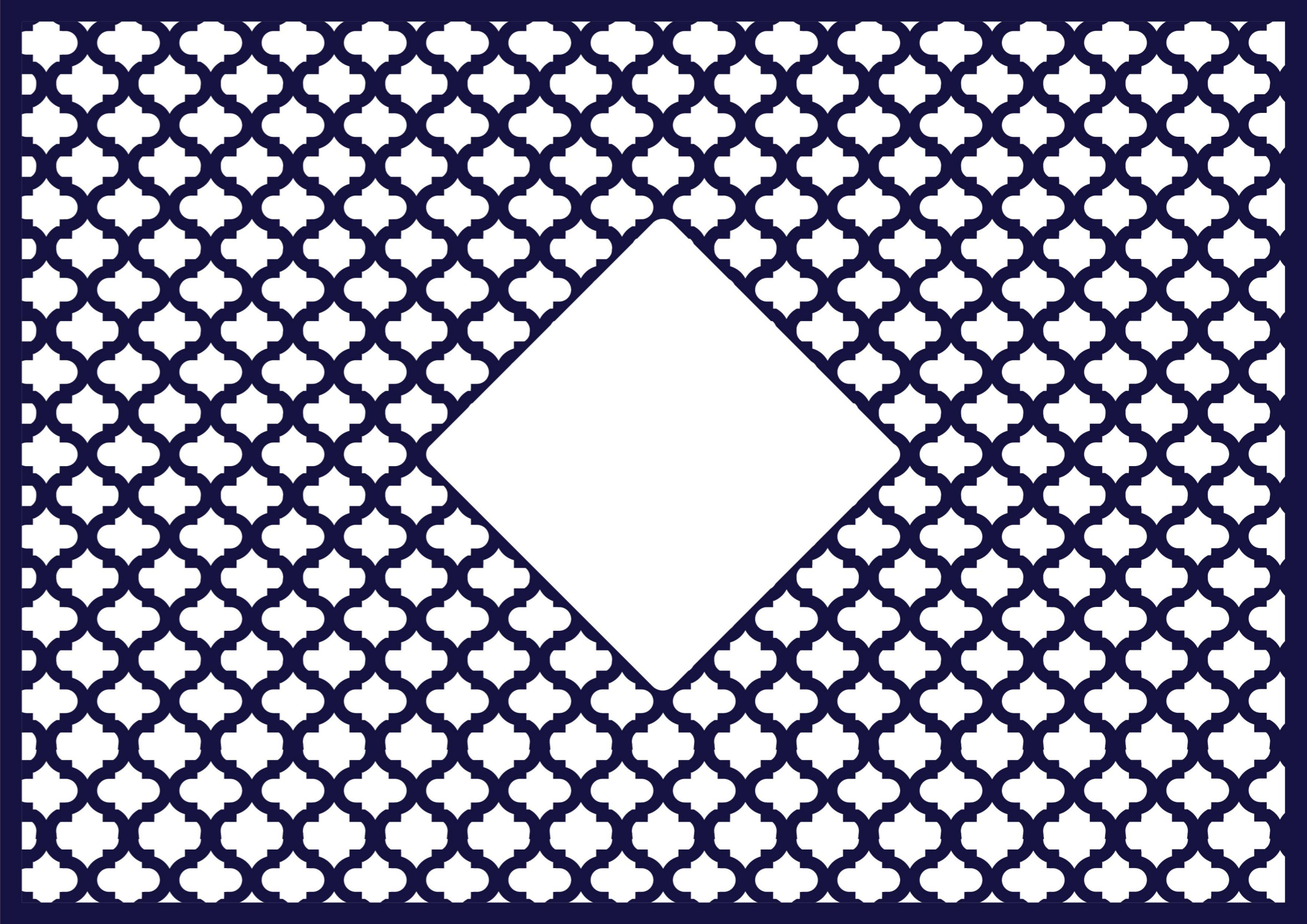

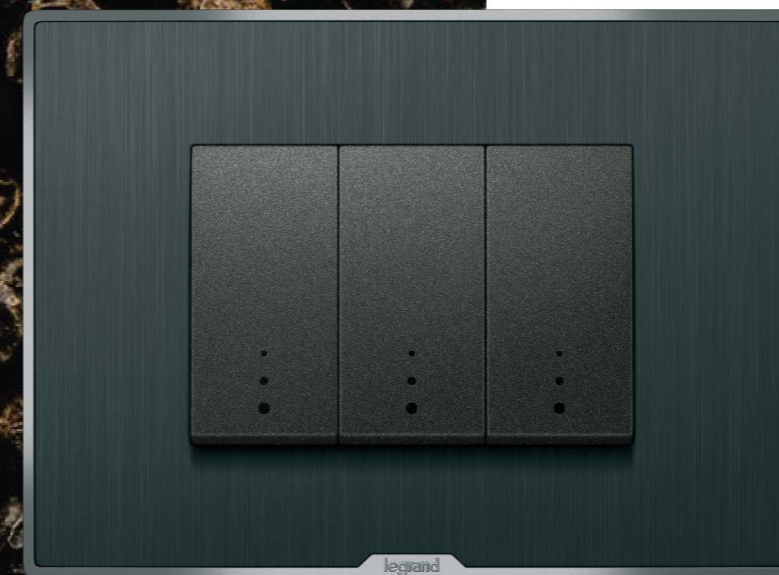
Inspired by traditional folk jewellery from Kutch, our brushed Sonic Silver finish is crafted to decorate the interiors of your home in royal hues.

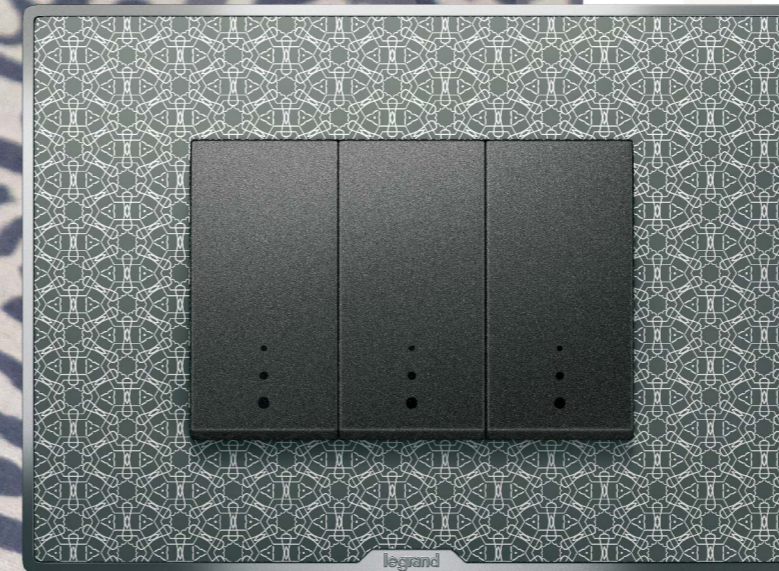


Dark Fade

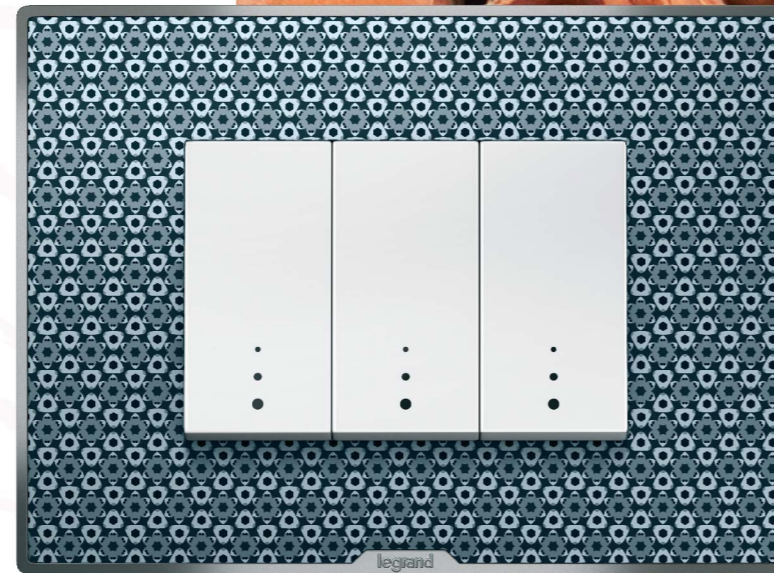


Interlude

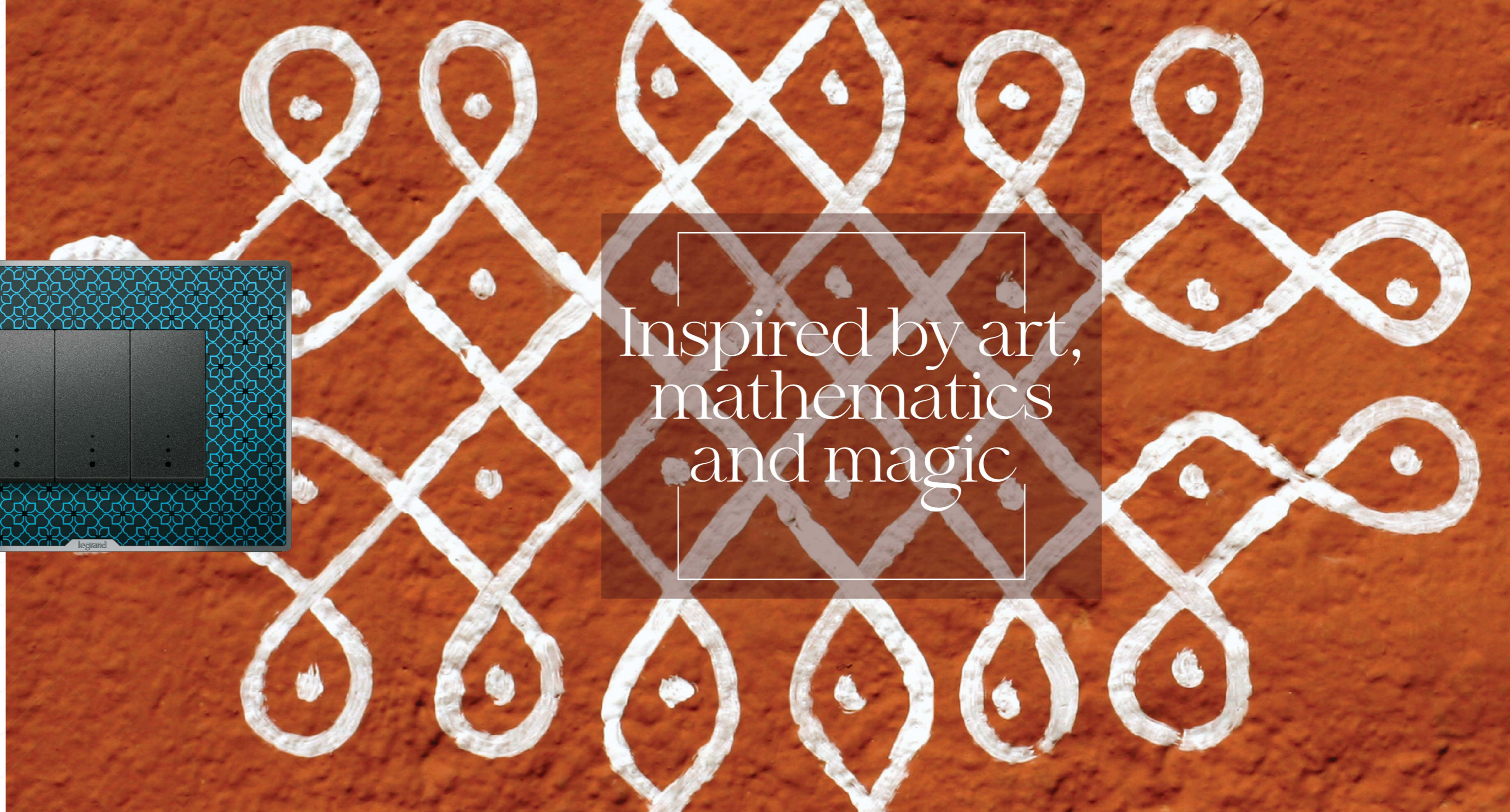
